## Update on the SWAN History Project

In recent months Marg Darcy and Diane McDonald have interviewed six of our founding members about the reasons why they established SWAN, the main things that stand out for them about the early days, examples of when SWAN was at its best and how it has changed over the past 25 years. We are most grateful to Val McKenna, Maureen McPhate, Fran Rule, Denise Hassett, Judith Graley and Debbie Roberts for their contributions. A summary of their input has now been collated. This will be circulated to SWAN members and put on the website, once it is finalised.

As part of this project, we are updating the SWAN website with Newsletters published between 2000-08. We have also developed a more comprehensive list of the hundreds of inspiring women who have been guest speakers at SWAN meetings over the past 25 years. This is a truly amazing record for a women's only, volunteer-led community organisation. One that would be very hard to beat!

But the history project is not yet finished! We are keen to gather further feedback from members who were involved in SWAN across the different eras. SWAN is a unique organisation with its focus on bringing together women of all ages and backgrounds from across the Mornington Peninsula, to learn about and discuss a broad range of social justice issues and to take action to achieve positive change in our own communities and beyond. We want others to hear about the SWAN story.

- What is/has been the significance of SWAN in your life?
- Can you suggest how SWAN could be further developed to ensure that it continues to contribute towards building a more just and equitable world?

#### **GENDER GAP GLOBAL RATINGS**

Joanna Hayter, our speaker at the recent SWAN meeting, drew our attention to the World Economic Forum Gender Gap Report 2021. Some of Australia's results are very concerning and, in response, it was moved that we should encourage members to contact MPs and candidates to seek their policy on addressing these concerns.

Australia Gender gap position has slipped from a rank of 15<sup>th</sup> in the world in 2006 to a rank of 50 in 2021. Meanwhile New Zealand has risen from rank 7 to rank 4 in the world in the same time. At 50<sup>th</sup> we are behind countries such as Ecuador, Mexico, El Salvador and Zimbabwe.

In Economic Participation and Opportunity Australia has fallen from 12<sup>th</sup> in the world in 2006 to 70<sup>th</sup> in 2021. Some of this is due to other countries improving, but our progress in closing the gap slipped from 71.8% in 2018 to 70 % in 2021. The worst result in this category was Estimated Earned Income which is 31,100 International dollars for women and 67,800 for men (International dollar has parity with US \$).

In Political Empowerment we are ranked 54<sup>th</sup> in the world and are only 21.8% of the way to closing the gap. Worst in this category is women in ministerial positions with 26.7% women to 73.3% men and women in parliament with 31.1% women and 68.9% men.

The report is interesting to read and easily found online, but the above should provide sufficient details for you to contact your MP and candidates drawing their attention to this report and seeking their policies to improve our Gender Gap standing and any other gender issues you are concerned about. The lead up to election is a particularly opportune time to bring such issues to their attention.

Flinders Electorate Candidates' Responses to The Uluru Statement from the Heart:1.Surbhi Snowball, Labor: I support the Uluru Statement from the Heart in its entirety. I also support a<br/>referendum that would enshrine a First Nations Voice in the Constitution. I think we need to<br/>decolonize Australia. Also, reparations are important. The land was never ceded.

2. Sarah Russell, Voices Independent: *The most important thing is to listen to First Nations people. Of course, I am committed to the Uluru Statement from the Heart and a constitutional First Nations Voice. I also think we have to have truth-telling federally, as is happening in Victoria.* 

3. Despi O'Connor, Independent: *I support and commit to enshrining a First Nations Voice in the Constitution. I hope to be the Minister that makes it happen.* 

4. The Greens: (policy statement) *The Australian Greens have always supported Truth, Treaty, and Voice and our policy continues to back these three elements, but a 'Treaty first' approach is essential to ensure that sovereignty is recognised. NB The Greens have recently announced that they would not oppose a referendum to enshrine a First Nations Voice in the Constitution.* 

5. Zoe McKenzie, Liberal: made a commitment to reply to the poll but had not done so at the time of writing. It is important to note the Prime Minister, on 2 May, made an announcement ruling out a constitutionally enshrined Voice.
