Fazila was born in Kabul Afghanistan. She is a graduate of the Faculty of Language and Literature at Kabul University. She has been living in Australia since 1986 and came here as a refugee.

After completing her education in Australia she has worked in many different public service organizations. Currently Fazila is teaching in a language school and working part time with SBS radio based in Melbourne as presenter and broadcaster.

Fazila is very passionate about helping widows and children of Afghanistan, particularly widows who lost everything during the past 30 years of civil war especially during the government of the Taliban. It is this passion that has led her to be involved with Tents4Peace International as the Deputy Chairperson.

"Refer often and refer early for the best results" is the mantra of Biala.

Marlene Fox is a dedicated educator. In her role as Manager of Biala Peninsula Early Childhood Intervention Services (ECIS) in Mornington, she focuses on children aged 0 to 6 with delays in their learning and disabilities with the aim of maximizing their chances for living life to the full.

Marlene discussed the services provided for 117 funded places currently being supported. Her staff includes: Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Music Therapists, Early Childhood Teachers,

Speech Pathologists and a lone male Graphic Designer. Biala depends also on strong volunteer support to deliver their vital range of services. She stressed the crucial role of family, particularly parents and grandparents in delivering an individual child's program.

Biala seeks philanthropic funding to augment other funding which helps in the expansion of the program.

Many of our members shared their positive experiences of Biala with stories of grandchildren and children 's successes over the years.

Members also commented on how informative and interesting they found her presentation. We thank Marlene for sharing her experiences and expertise in such a lovely and warm manner.
