Natalie Collard
Winner of the 2013 Telstra Victorian
Women's Business - Community &
Government Award



Apart from her Telstra Community and Government award, in March 2013, the National Australia Bank (NAB) Women's Agenda Leadership Awards announced Natalie as a national finalist in its Emerging Leader in the Public or Not for Profit category. The NAB sponsored women's leadership award recognises women that are agenda-setters, leaders in their field and celebrating the valuable contribution women make to Australian business.

Natalie Collard was appointed Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Australian Dairy Farmers (ADF) in June 2011. Prior to joining ADF in November 2008 as the Deputy CEO/General Manager, Natalie was the Manager-Rural Affairs for the National Farmers' Federation (NFF), Australia's peak agricultural lobby group. Kylee Bates—States Director of Mission Australia

March Speaker

What do young people value? What are their educational aspirations? How important is family?

Kylee Bates, State Director of Mission Australia, talked about the results of their recent National Youth Survey in Australia. Mission Australia focusses particularly on supporting young people who are disadvantaged, disengaged or transitioning from the Juvenile Justice services. In order to understand youth concerns, Mission Australia conducts an annual National Survey of youth aged 15-19 years. In 2013, 15,000 young people responded.

According to the COAG Reform Council of 2012 a quarter of Australians aged between 18 -24 were unlikely to be studying, learning new skills or working. In that same year teenagers were three time more likely to be unemployed. Kylee Bates, stated that Mission Australia believes there should be more school-based programmes to prepare teenagers for work and on-going support once they gain employment

More young men than young school women felt they would not finish secondary education. Mission Australia offers support to teenagers through Community Groups to provide reassurance, and information regarding schooling, relationships and their future and lead them away from drugs and alcohol.

SWAN members learnt of the wide range of services Mission Australia has established from social enterprises such as "Charcoal Lane Restaurant, which provides training for Indigenous youth in hospitality, also 14 Early Learning Centres and they are providers of affordable housing. Results from their Youth Survey indicated young people's overwhelming desire to complete their Secondary Education, young people's high level of participation in sport and a high level of valuing of family.

Natalie was previously a Director of Agsafe Limited and played a key role in driving improved environmental stewardship and training outcomes for the agriculture sector, including founding AgStewardship Australia to deliver the DrumMUSTER and ChemClear agricultural recycling programs.

Natalie's non-agricultural career highlights include two stints in Minister's offices, managing an emergency post-September 11 arms control meeting of the Australia Group (32 countries, chaired by Australia) and addressing the United Nations in Geneva on the Optional protocol to the Biological Weapons Convention also in 2001.

She has managed two \$600 million corporate contracts and, as Defence's lead negotiator on security treaties, delivered Australia's first treaty with an organisation, NATO.

Natalie is a Graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors and has a Bachelor of Arts (Social Sciences) from La Trobe University for which she was awarded membership of the Golden Key Honour Society. Natalie is currently undertaking a Graduate Diploma of Management.


