## 16 Days of ActivismAgainst Gendered Violence

Starting Sunday 25 November on the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, and finishing Tuesday 10 December on Human Rights Day, 16 Days of Activism is an annual global campaign against gender-based violence.

#### The theme for 2024: 'Respect is ...'.

In the lead up to the campaign, SWAN is hosting anti-violence activist **Dr Helen Keleher to present at our General Meeting on Sunday 17 November at Mt Martha House** – see flyer on page 3 for details. We encourage members to **come wearing orange and bring a placard calling for Respect and an end to violence.** A **group photo** – of those who wish to participate - will be taken at the end of the meeting to promote **SWAN's March Against Gender-Based Violence**. Professor Helen Keleher's experience in the prevention of violence against women (PVAW) and women's health extends over decades – from nursing and public health to academia and consulting.

Prof. Keleher has been a member of the World Health Organisation Women and Gender Equity Knowledge Network (2006-2008); Chair of the Australian Women's Health Network; President of the Public Health Association of Australia; Convenor of the 2017 World Congress on Public Health held in Melbourne; and co-author of 'Change the Story: A Shared Framework for the Primary Prevention of Violence Against Women and Their Children in Australia' (2015, 2018).

With a focus on activism for gender and health equity, Prof. Keleher will address some of the family violence prevention strategies from Victoria's 2015 Royal Commission recommendations. She will also overview the infrastructure and programs in Victoria changing the long-standing patriarchal cultures that support gender inequality.

As stories of male high school students ranking their female peers via sexualised spreadsheets hit the headlines, it's clear that education around treating girls and women with respect needs to be examined more closely.

In Jane Gilmore's insightful new book, *Fairytale Princesses Will Kill Your Children*, she explores what fairy tale princesses, rape myths and the *Fixed It project* (on violence and the representation of women in the media) have in common.

In this important live event, Jane talks with writer and interviewer Claire Halliday to discuss how parents, carers and educators can work together to help support young people and reduce the risks of gendered violence. Jane is an author, journalist, feminist, and consent educator.



## New SWAN Bursary builds on the longterm generosity of our members

Since it was established in 1996, SWAN has assisted countless women to pursue their own social justice journeys. One way of doing this was through the generous donations made by members to fund bursaries to help young women to complete their education. Initially several 'Community Participation Encouragement' Awards were given to encourage local students aged 16 - 26 years to take up training in public speaking, public presentation and media management. The inaugural recipient of this youth award in 2005 was Bonnie Einsiedel. Bonnie remains an active SWAN member to this day.

Between 2011-2019, under the umbrella of **Graduate Women Victoria**, more substantive bursaries were awarded. These funds supported nine disadvantaged students to undertake

tertiary studies leading to careers associated with human rights, equity and social justice. Several recipients of these awards were Aboriginal women.

In 2025 and again in 2026, we are redirecting the annual SWAN bursary to help meet the education expenses of two students in Years 10 or 11, one from Rosebud Secondary College and the other from Western Port Secondary College. As well as helping to cover education costs, this new bursary aims to nurture the student's potential to contribute to positive societal change. Award recipients will be announced at end of year school assemblies.

We have named SWAN's new bursary the 'Val McKenna Young Women's Advocacy Award' in recognition of one of the remarkable pioneering women who established SWAN almost 30 years ago. Val was instrumental in spearheading a campaign on the Peninsula that led to the release of Heather Osland (a victim of domestic violence) who had been unjustly imprisoned for the murder of her husband in 1996.

A celebration to launch this new bursary is being held on Tuesday 19 November at Mt Martha Community House. This will be attended by staff representatives from the participating schools, the Mornington Peninsula Shire and the Mornington Peninsula Foundation (MPF). We are most grateful to MPF for the generous support it is providing to help us administer these bursaries. This ensures that donations made to the SWAN Bursary are tax deductible.





## National Conference 2024 Rural Australians for Refugees

Held during 11-13<sup>th</sup> of October 2024 in Kyneton, the Rural Australians for Refugees (RAR) National Conference was attended by SWAN members Maryanne Barclay, facilitator of Dunkley Grandmothers for Refugees (G4R), and Marilyn Hoban, G4R member. Dr Jean Ker Walsh and her Kyneton-based team of Rural Australians for Refugees did a magnificent job organizing and running this very informative but at times confronting conference. Keynote Speaker Behrouz Boochani along with artist Mostafa Azimitabar, Human Rights lawyer Prof Gillian Triggs, refugee lawyer David Manne, Sister Brigid Arthur from the Brigidine Asylum Seekers Project and more than 32 other presenters spoke about their work in advocating justice, liberty and support for those seeking a new life in Australia.

The Labor Government have made improvements but there are still 43 seriously ill men on Manus Island, 93 on Nauru, and over 7000 in the community with no work rights, access to education or Medicare. On a global scale there are over 120 million refugees on the move, mostly settled in neighbouring poorer countries. Across the Western World there has been a decline for the respect of International Law in relation to refugees. Yet Australia accepts only 20,000 refugees per year!! We must change the narrative, change hearts and minds and give these people hope, liberty and a sense of belonging. Local communities can make it happen. We need to keep fighting to shape the type of communities that we can thrive in.


