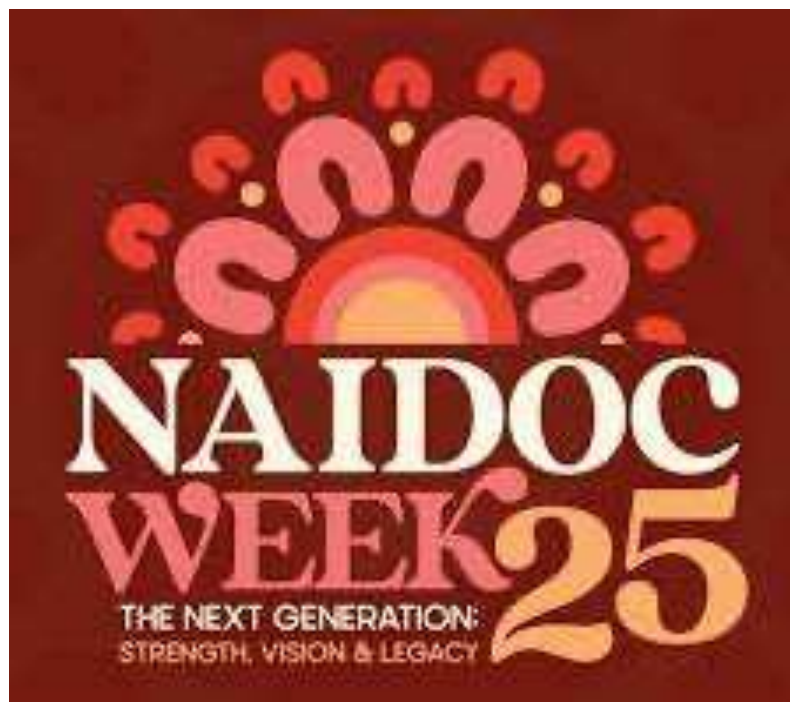

# SWAN Women for Housing Justice: Update

The SWAN Women for Housing Justice (SW4HJ) group is continuing to meet and discuss our next steps post the 2025 federal election.

Judith has attended the Mornington Peninsula Shire Council (MPSC) **Triple A Housing Committee** meeting where discussion focused on the need to progress applications for new crisis accommodation and social housing developments advocated by MPSC and organisations such as Fusion. Attention should also be maintained on the state of **335 Main Street** which has seen some improvements lately. For example, in regards to maintenance as well as the establishment of a residents' monthly barbeque, under the auspice of MPSC.

The **Launch ZERO** housing and homelessness data continues to worsen, therefore necessitating continued work to get more accommodation options and funding applications. Chair of the Triple A committee **Cr David Gill** has asked that their next meeting focus solely on opportunities and ideas in the housing space that he can speak about to the other councillors.

Congratulations to the local **Community Support Centres** and the leadership role played by our group member **Belinda Rodman** in securing new crisis accommodation in Mornington: RANCH 2.0. We are hopeful this successful partnership model can be replicated elsewhere. See MPNEWS article, 4/6/2025, available on their website: *'Peninsula crisis accommodation saved with Ranch 2.0'*.

In coming weeks, the group will meet with **MPSC Mayor Anthony Marsh and CEO Mark Stoermer**. We are also planning to hold another gathering of the Roundtable attendees in late August.
